4.	Construction Update – Building 2, Public Domain and Locomotive Workshop		
	Warren Henson provided an overview of the major construction activities scheduled between September and November 2019.  Building 2:		
	<ul> <li>Lots of construction activity underway.</li> <li>Roof works almost complete.</li> <li>Plantroom is due to be completed end of September.</li> <li>Internal services are continuing - now waterproof.</li> <li>Ground plane façade works commenced to Locomotive Street and Central Avenue.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Locomotive Workshop:</li> <li>Several more weeks of stripping out the 90's fit out.</li> <li>All heritage items have been taken off site, catalogued and stored.</li> <li>Construction has commenced onsite with piling and civil works underway in Bays 1 – 4a.</li> <li>Removal of 90's fit out to continue in Bays 5 – 8.</li> <li>Structural steel erection forecast to commence in October.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Public Domain</li> <li>Locomotive Street works are ongoing, including paving.</li> <li>Pedestrian and traffic diversions are in place.</li> <li>Works to Village Square were delayed slightly due to weather conditions. Due to be completed shortly.</li> <li>Central Avenue is being replanted with kerb and gutter.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Feedback</li> <li>RJ – can we get an update on what heritage interpretation is planned for Building 2?</li> <li>NV – we'll be including inlays and references to the Foundry in the public domain, as well as the travelator and basement airlock. There will be a small exhibition space here, as well as a range of different LED lights and footage. This detail was submitted as part of the Stage 2 HIP, which has</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>been approved by DPIE.</li> <li>RJ – this proposal is quite different from what was proposed 1.5 years ago.</li> <li>US – the travellator interpretation plans were submitted as part of the Locomotive Workshop SSDAs.</li> <li>RJ – can we be given a presentation on the heritage interpretation plans for Building 2 at an upcoming CLG meeting?</li> <li>US – yes.</li> </ul>	Mirvac to present on the Stage 2 HIP for the Public Domain at an upcoming CLG meeting.

	Natalie Vinton provided a heritage update on the Locomotive Workshop,		
	including recent modification.		
	<ul> <li>The internal design for Locomotive Workshop has now been almost finalised.</li> <li>All leasing arrangements are underway.</li> <li>The Stage 2 Heritage Interpretation Plan for the Locomotive Workshop has been signed off by DPIE.</li> </ul>

	The Stage 3 Design Implementation works are being developed in	
	<ul> <li>consultation with the Buchan Group.</li> <li>The next phase of heritage interpretation includes interviews with key knowledge-holders and experts to gather oral histories. This information will be used as part of the interpretation on site and within digital</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>products.</li> <li>To refine our heritage interpretation plans we'll also be working with experts including historians, museum curators, digital interpreters, fit-out designers, and archaeological experts.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The demolition of the current fitout in the Locomotive Workshop has been recorded with photographs and 3D scans. This material will be used in our heritage interpretation.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Plans for the Workers Wall are yet to be finalised, but the design process will commence in the coming months.</li> <li>The current focus of heritage interpretation is on finalising the design of the Blacksmith's Workshop in consultation with the blacksmith. Details</li> </ul>

A digital overlay was proposed by the Association and others and the matters relating to databases has yet to be resolved as have a number of other issues including :the inclusion of some 50,000 Eveleigh employees names on the Workers Wall, the form of the digital overlay, the location of the wall, the process for designing the wall including an international design competition and the timescale for its installation and unveiling.</li> <li>US - DPIE have approved the Stage 2 HIP for the Locomotive Workshop - they are satisfied that the consultation requirements were met.</li> <li>NV - the Stage 2 HIP for the Locomotive Workshop outlines the detailed design principles for the physical Workers Wall.</li> </ul>	
6.	Redfern Station Upgrade – Option 5 Presentation (Community Option)	
	<ul> <li>Damian Minton provided an overview of Option 5 for the Redfern Station Upgrades.</li> <li>ReConnect Redfern have presented Option 5 to a number of agencies, and it has been submitted to Transport for NSW (TfNSW). TfNSW is now assessing it.</li> <li>The objectives of Option 5 are to: <ul> <li>Support the improvement of Redfern Station accessibility.</li> <li>Improve pedestrian rail commuter flow and reduce congestion.</li> <li>Enhance public pedestrian and bicycle connectivity to key local destinations.</li> <li>Protect and promote heritage and local culture.</li> <li>Retain local residential amenity.</li> </ul> </li> <li>ReConnect Redfern support the addition of six new sets of stairs and lifts. However, ReConnect Redfern believe TfNSW should broaden the width of the concourse bridge to promote public pedestrian and bicycle connectivity. Non-commuters should also be able to use it.</li> <li>Little Eveleigh Street entry point: ReConnect Redfern believe that this access point will have a negative impact on this quiet residential street.</li> <li>Marian Street entry point: ReConnect Redfern believe that this entry point will have a negative impact on the amenity of the Watertower building.</li> <li>Option 5 is the only viable option – it meets all objectives outlines by TfNSW and provides improved connectivity, reduces traffic and safety issues, and maximises residential amenity.</li> <li>SC - thankyou to Reconnect Redfern. TfNSW have now finished consultation and are now assessing the findings of consultation. TfNSW will publish a consultation report addressing the final decision that is made. Happy to come back and present this and the consultation outcomes in a future meeting.</li> <li>MB - the broader connectivity report prepared by TfNSW has not been released yet. Can you please release that first? It was promised a while ago.</li> <li>SC - we need to talk about this project holistically so will likely release information about the wider precinct and station upgrade together.</li> </ul>	TfNSW to present on consultation outcomes relating to Redfern Station Upgrades at a future meeting.

They're exploring increased density along Regent Street, Botany Road, Gibbons Street and Cleveland Street. They will also be discussing the preparation of 'character statements' etc, in relation to the new LEP and development controls.
